


# Dhelkunyangu Gatjin

The 2024-2025 Gatjin Strategy Implementation Plan describes the activities and initiatives determined by the Wanngal<sup>1</sup> Group to best progress the implementation of Dhelkunyangu Gatjin (The Gatjin Strategy).

and the associated Natural Resource Agreement.



The first year of implementing the Gatjin Strategy has seen progress along each of the barings. Significant progress has been made establishing the governance arrangements and working with partners to implement the Gatjin Strategy objectives. The Wanggal Group has been established. The Wanggal Group endorsed the 2023/24 Implementation Plan, oversaw its implementation and have led the development of the 2024/25 Implementation Plan. The Wanggal Group have included Kapa Gatjin representatives into their meetings.

Dja Dja Wurrung have communicated directly with the Water Agencies Djaara's (Dja Dja Wurrung People's) ambitions to be involved in water management. This included presentations to all of the Boards and senior executive teams of the water agencies that operate on Djandak (Dja Dja Wurrung Country).

The Gatjin Team has worked with DEECA to develop water accounts for Djandak and have developed an Environmental Contribution (EC6) bid for a trial to establish a Djaara Gatjin Authority, that describes the high-level model and seeks funding to develop a detailed business case and to establish an Authority.

A Djimbunang (milestone) indicator to define a Cultural Water Right has not progressed as further defining a Cultural Water Right beyond the Echuca Declaration 2007 definition was considered not required to be able to progress opportunities for Djaara owned and managed water rights. However, significant effort was dedicated to reviewing and improving the Aboriginal Waterway Assessment (AWA) process and undertaking AWAs, which is an important precursor for determining a Cultural Water Right.



#### 2023/2024 Lessons

This 2024/25 year is the first opportunity for a co-developed implementation plan, where the priorities and Djimbunang indicators are set by the Wanggal Group and used by the DJANDAK Gatjin Team and Wanggal Group partner agencies to determine the 2024/25 actions and initiatives as part of their business planning processes.

It builds on the inaugural 2023/2024 Implementation Plan that was developed by the DJANDAK Gatjin Team and subsequently endorsed by the Wanggal Group. A codeveloped plan leads to a more comprehensive plan but with realistic solutions and shared ownership of outcomes, ultimately enhancing implementation efficiency and effectiveness.

An end-of-year Wanggal Group review of the 2023/24 Implementation Plan identified that:

- The 2023/24 plan was overly ambitious, considering the available resources and the realistic timeframes for planning and delivering a coordinated approach to complex projects and transformational initiatives.
   This is compounded, as the Wanggal Group is charting a new collaborative approach which takes time to embed. Consistency of membership from agency representatives assists with embedding the collaboration and ways of working together.
- The implementation of key actions was overly and unnecessarily dependent on the DJANDAK Gatjin Team.
- Agency projects were not explicitly responding to the Gatjin Strategy objectives and outcomes.
- The original concept of a 3 year implementation plan, resulted in an implementation plan that incorporated many prospective projects that

- would not commence in the focus year. This results in both a cluttered plan, but also effort to consider the prospective projects at the expense of existing projects. The intent in this plan is to focus on projects that are underway or will commence in 2024/2025.
- Separate tables for agency projects didn't enable full line of sight to the strategy outcomes. Alignment could be better displayed through integrating agency projects under each Baring. Applicability of the projects with multiple agencies can then be identified to foster collaboration and co-delivery of opportunities.

Kapa Gatjin (The Djaara Water Knowledge group) has assigned a representative to attend Wanggal meetings over 23/24. This will continue as a permanent arrangement in 24/25.

In response, the 2024/25 Implementation Plan aims to be more realistic, albeit still outlining an ambitious program to progress the Gatjin Strategy objectives. Wanggal Group partner agencies are being asked to better support and lead the delivery of actions and initiatives. The role of Djaara in each of the Djaara Centred Projects has been dropped from the 2024/25 tables with the expectation that each project will have its own project plan that puts Djaara at the center in a way that is appropriate for each project.

To better involve Kapa Gatjin members and to build members' understanding of Djaara the Wanggal meetings could be "Djaara-fied" to reflect Djaara ways of thinking and doing.

### Focus for 2024/2025

To deliver the Gatjin Strategy outcomes, the Wanggal Group has set the following focus areas for 2024/25:

- Establish a pilot Djaara Gatjin Authority to demonstrate proof of concept.
- Enhance Wanggal Group's co-delivery functions.
- Increase capability of DJANDAK Gatjin Team and Agency staff.
- Agree on Dja Dja Wurrung involvement in water agencies' decision-making processes.
- Establish effective arrangements for Kapa Gatjin guidance and input.
- Determine pathways for Dja Dja Wurrung to become Environmental Water Holders, waterway managers and hold cultural water entitlements.

- Continue to develop and grow the Djaara Cultural Water Knowledge hub to activate Djaara Cultural Water Rights.
- Formalise Dja Dja Wurrung water ownership through existing avenues and identify new opportunities.

The focus on governance and oversight and making decisions for water will continue throughout 24/25. There is a real need to continue this focus to establish the foundations for working together and developing the frameworks required to deliver the more complex initiatives to secure Culture Water and Water Entitlements that require changes to the current framework.

## Wanggal Collaboration and Partnerships

In addition to the Wanggal partners there are other agencies and forums that perform a critical role in water management on Djandak. These agencies and forums will be engaged as required by the relevant Wanggal partner to support the delivery of Initiatives and Djaara Centred Projects.

Each year, the Dja Dja Wurrung Group, will convene a Natural Resources Agreement Forum with all of their partners' to discuss delivery of partners Recognition and Settlement Agreement (RSA) commitments and how the application of Djaara Knowledge and Lore can improve natural resource management on Djandak.

#### **Action Plan**

The actions are organised under 'Initiatives' which are actions directly related to achieving the strategic outcomes for the Dhelkunyangu Gatjin Strategy; and 'Djaara Centred Projects' which are projects already underway or planned which with the direction of Dhelkunyangu Gatjin and

Wanggal partners will be delivered in a way that acknowledges and respects Djaara's role as rights holders of all water on Djandak.

Initiatives and Djaara Centred Projects are linked through the tables from the Baring milestone in the left-hand column - Initiatives and Djaara Centred Projects are not necessarily linked to each other.
